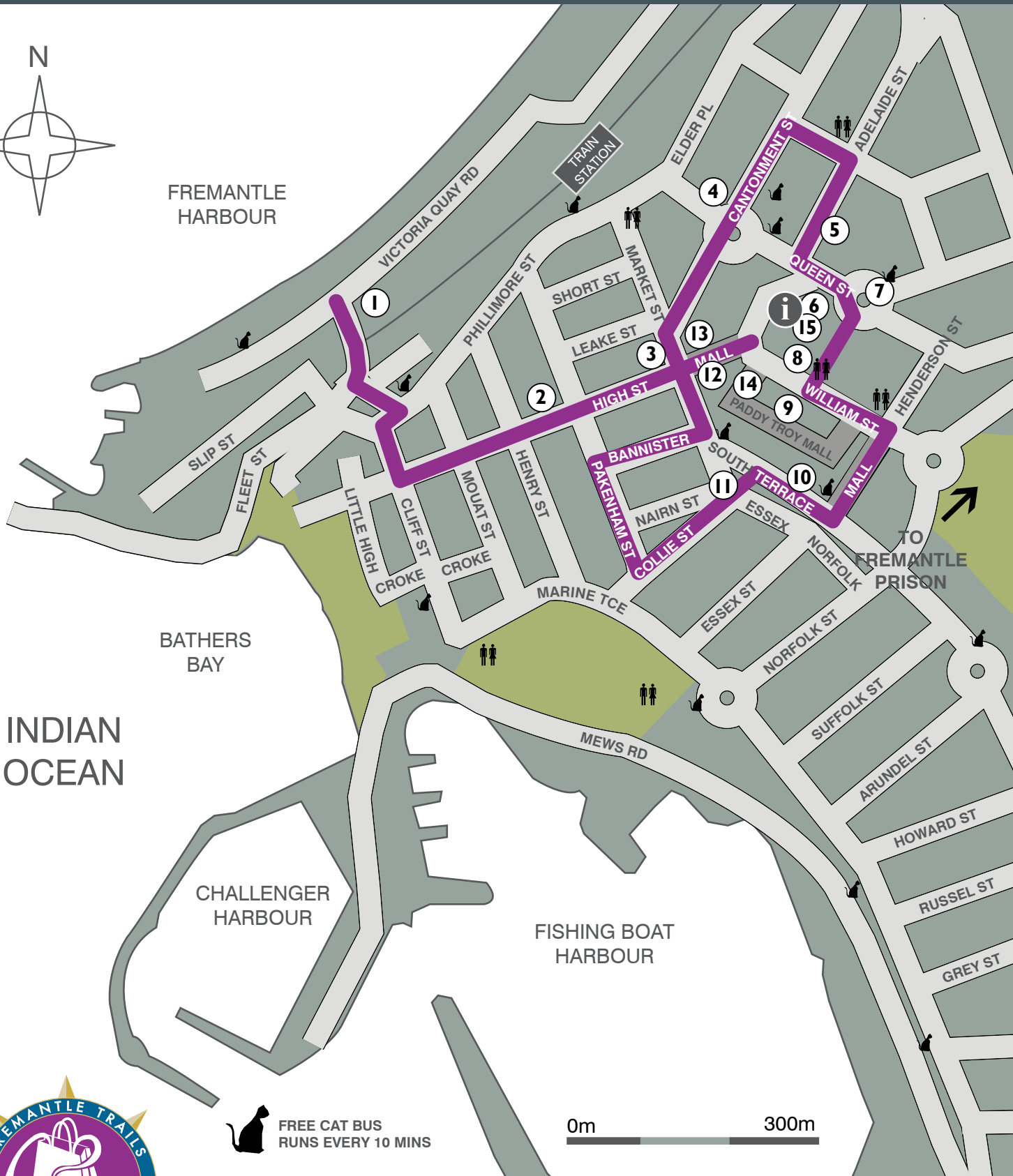
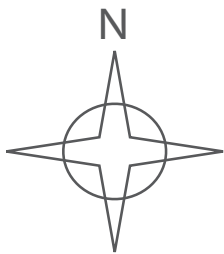

# Retail & Fashion Trail

Fremantle's eclectic mix of retail stores and boutiques constantly evolves. This trail takes you on a tour of Fremantle from the buzz of market shopping to the haute couture of designer fashion. Meander around the arcades, markets and malls. A lovely way to spend a day or a couple of hours.

1. **Victoria Quay** – Home to the E Shed Markets and eclectic mix of stalls, fresh produce & eateries with a fantastic view over the inner Harbour.
2. **High Street west** – From the lights on Market Street down to the Round House is fast becoming the fashion centre of this City. Nothing mainstream about these labels! Many of Fremantle's up and coming fashion designers have set up in this area.
3. **Market Street west** – From the Railway Station to the cappuccino strip is a lovely strip of stores. Beads, men & women's clothing, gorgeous kitchenware and gifts, shoes – you could find anything. Allow lots of time to leisurely browse and take a break with a coffee or restorative cuppa to prepare you for the next stage of the trail.
4. **Cantonment Street** – Has some rather interesting shops on this street. On the corner of Queen & Cantonment streets is the Woolstores Shopping Centre with all the basics including a supermarket, butcher, newsagent and chemist. Across the road is a store dedicated to environmentally friendly products.
5. **Adelaide Street** – This strip is home to the Fremantle Shopping Centre which houses a supermarket and various specialty stores. You will also find bikes to knitting needles, blinds to massage, everything goes on this strip.
6. **Kings Square** – Around this central square in Fremantle are located many national brands department stores.
7. **High Street east** – From the roundabout walking east to the lights you will find a cluster of Fremantle's secondhand stores, great for Retro fashions. Take a peek down Tum Tum Tree Lane.
8. **William Street** – Surrounds the Town Hall. In it you will find secondhand bookshops, bead stores, department stores, pick up a pair of walking shoes for those tired shopping feet or sit down and enjoy a coffee.
9. **Fremantle Mall** – This mall links William Street and the "Café Strip", exploring this area will lead you to the South Terrace Piazza where you will find children's clothes, Retro gear, jewellery, Indian clothing and even ugg boots.
10. **South Terrace** – At the Henderson Street corner you will find the Fremantle Markets with everything from fresh and interesting foods, to fantastic crafts, gifts and the fun of buskers and artists. Open Friday, Saturday, Sunday & Monday public holidays. Stroll west along South Terrace for the bookshops, boutiques and candy store.

11. **Collie Street** – A lovely row of stores sits on this strip leading down to the Esplanade Park. A local childrenswear designer, fashion, shoes, and the Chart shop where you can buy a map of anywhere in the world.
12. **High Street Mall** – The centre of Fremantle and home to bookstores, kitchen stores and fashion. Enjoy a stroll along this mall – take a break at one of the cafes and listen to the buskers perfect their craft.
13. **Atwell Arcade** – Tucked away in this arcade you can watch candy being made, be pampered or buy a model car. It's one of Fremantle's secrets.
14. **Manning Arcade** – Anything new age or funky and fashionable is tucked away here.
15. **Fremantle Village Art Markets** – During the summer months (weather permitting) Kings square is filled with the Fremantle Village Art Markets, every Thursday from October to April, featuring local artists & designers, craftspeople and live music.

This trail includes the main shopping areas with a brief summary of some of the features of that area. There is so much more to discover, new stores will open, others will move and some will close. Keep your eyes open for new and interesting stores popping up.
